

Title I Distinguished Schools Named

The West Virginia Department of Education is pleased to announce the 2012-2013 Title I Distinguished Schools. A school must meet the following requirements to be named a Title I Distinguished School:

- Be in operation for at least three or more consecutive years;
- Be a Title I school for three or more consecutive years;
- Receive full West Virginia accreditation status from the Office of Education Performance Audits;
- Be named a West Virginia Reward School under ESEA Flexibility;
- Demonstrate the required Annual Measurable Objectives (AMO) target for the total subgroup in both reading/language arts and mathematics (for 2013 WESTEST 2 the AMO target was 60% proficient);
- Title I schools without tested grades (PK-2), the Reward School and AMO requirements are replaced with an application that demonstrates the high-quality early learning programs provided by the school.

The 2013 Title I Distinguished Schools are:

- Normantown Elementary School – Gilmer County
- Moorefield Elementary School – Hardy County
- Brandywine Elementary School – Pendleton County
- Crescent Elementary School – Raleigh County
